## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Dear Bendigo District RSL Sub-Branch Inc Members and Families,

I trust this report finds you well on the other side of the Annual General Meeting and Anzac Day, a very busy period on our calendar.

Welfare: Our Welfare Team has continued to actively reach out to all Service and Life Members. Through phone calls and personalised communication, we assess each Veteran's situation to provide the necessary resources and support. I was delighted to announce that all veterans were eligible for a complimentary 'Roast of the Day' during



lunch on Anzac Day and many took the opportunity to be able to sit down and relax with a nice meal. We continue to connect to Veterans and their dependents through direct liaison, outreach and referrals from VetCen. Considerable work goes on behind the scenes in this area that provides our vulnerable Veterans and their dependents with required support and referrals.

**Outreach and Engagement:** Our Sub-Branch remains active across various areas in our buildings, local community, and broader region. We've initiated the formal process of establishing a Central Victorian Veterans and Families Hub, collaborating with organisations including BDRSL, RSL Victoria, Bendigo Legacy Club, and Vietnam Veterans Association Bendigo Branch. Our engagement with Veterans continues through events such as Veteran nights, morning teas, informal gatherings, and sheds programs. The Bendigo Military Museum's Faces of Peace Exhibition, showcasing our local Veterans' experiences, has also been a significant success and will continue for an extended period.

National Volunteer Week was celebrated with our Sub-Branch hosting a special event where we were able to celebrate the invaluable contributions of our dedicated RSL volunteers. The event was titled " Celebrating Our RSL Community Champions," and recognised and appreciated the exceptional efforts of many of the Sub-Branch volunteers.

**Collaboration:** We continue to work closely with RSL State Executive, RSL Region 7, and other Ex-Service Organisations to support our Veterans. Meetings such as the January Region 7 gathering in Bendigo, the March meeting in Castlemaine, and the May meeting in Koondrook have been productive. We extend our congratulations to Immediate Past President Peter Swandale for his current role in the RSL Victoria State Executive who attends our Region 7 meetings as part of his role.

**2024 Anzac Day:** This year's Anzac Day held special significance as the march in Bendigo was led by peacekeepers. It's a proud tradition, honouring the contributions of Australians in maintaining global peace and security since 1947.


## **VETERAN SUPPORT- WELFARE**

The BDRSL Welfare Program, through the Welfare and Charitable Sub-Committee (WCSC) delivers direct proactive support, connection and outreach to the Veteran community through face to face and telephone contact and off-site visitation. Service personal identified through networking, word of mouth and direct referral are supported in-house and followed up directly by the Welfare Advocate. Other contacts are connected to appropriate adjunct agencies to facilitate both autonomous support and ease of access to those support interventions. The Welfare Program strongly networks with all local and Statewide ESOs and support agencies to establish and cement sound relationships of support, trust and integrity.

This quarterly report provides an overview of activities, initiatives, and developments pertaining to the WCSC supported by the Bendigo District RSL Sub-Branch during the reporting period of December 2023 - June 2024. The report highlights key achievements, challenges, and ongoing efforts to enhance the welfare and support of Veterans and their dependents in the region.

### **Veterans Engagement and Support:**

The Welfare Program has continued the initiative that was commenced in 2023 to contact all identified Veterans within the District who are on the RSL's database. At the time of writing close to 75% of service personnel – out of a total of close to 900 - have been contacted and offered welcome, connection, support, and assistance on their terms. While the majority of contacts require no further assistance the consultative analysis undertaken post-contact identifies approximately 20% who are in need of or request support for common themes such as financial support, assistance with house/garden tasks, and opportunities for social inclusion.



- Total contacts include: ad hoc walk ins, telephone contacts, visitations, and call outs.
- External referrals include: DVA support issues, legal advice, welfare / financial support, Veteran's support services.
- Financial assistance includes: individual food / fuel vouchers, utilities support, home / garden maintenance support.
- Meals distributed include: individual fresh and frozen take away meals only.
- Practical assistance includes: assessment/authorising of home maintenance tasks, pickup from individual homes to appointments, liaising with 3rd parties etc.
- External representation includes: any initiated networking and collegial opportunities with sector colleagues and associated agencies.

## VETERAN SUPPORT- WELFARE

#### Outreach:

A strength-based networking and outreach strategy has been pursued by the incumbent Welfare Advocate. Local Exservice Organisations - Rochester RSL, Shepparton RSL and Castlemaine RSL have been contacted and key personal communicated with. Organisations such as Lifeline Bendigo/Goldfields, the Veteran's Counselling Service, and Uniting Agewell for example have been networked within this report period.

### Outreach and connection has identified issues such as:

- The difficulty involved in working through compensation issues with DVA. The Welfare Advocate has sourced other referral points for Military Compensation Advocacy and has safe, sensitive and competent agents acting on behalf of Veterans.
- The need for social connection which is absent from a lot of Veterans lives. A significant number speak of a sense of loneliness in their lives. Proactive inclusion is achieved through invitational outreach to the BDRSL Sheds program, Veteran's in-house social functions, and other affiliated community activities.
- Many Veterans need to seek support to complete routine domestic tasks such as gardening chores or internal / external home maintenance. Amongst other issues that this raises there are greater incurred financial expenses.
- Many are struggling with the impact of advancing age and the lessening of cognitive and physical capacity. This has an impact upon self-esteem and self-confidence.

### **Upcoming Initiatives:**

- The Welfare & Charitable Sub-Committee is considering ways to resurrect the Hospital Visitation Program that was in place before the impact of Covid closed down contact and on-site visitation.
- The Welfare program is also considering recruitment to bolster the endeavours of current members and sustain the sub-committee.
- The Welfare Hub is under-resourced and utilised.
- More "welfare-specific" activities could be organised. The welfare advocateA has plans to aggressively drive this with the up-coming commencement of the new Veteran's Activities Coordinator.

The Sub-Committee remains committed to supporting the welfare of Veterans. We continue to foster a strong pro-active and supportive community for veterans in the region by supporting our Veterans through effective welfare programs and initiatives.



# **ANZAC Day**

Thank you one and all for helping us to commemorate ANZAC Day this year. The turnout from the people of Bendigo for both the Dawn Service and the morning service was amazing. It is vitally important that the commemoration of this sacred day be held in the highest esteem, to remember the service and sacrifice given to our nation by so many over so many years, in so many conflicts.















## **BENDIGO MILITARY MUSEUM**

The Bendigo Military Museum continues its efforts to honour the service and sacrifice of local Veterans by preserving the rich military history of our region. We remain focused on working with the community to improve our collection and exhibits whilst planning for the future to provide a museum the Sub-Branch can be proud of.

The year commenced with the Golden Rivers Artist exhibition and was followed in Autumn with the Faces of Peace exhibition which showcased local veterans in Peackekeeping, Peacebuilding and Peacemaking operations around the world. Faces of Peace opened on the 5th April and has been extremely well received so it has now been decided to extend its tenure to November 2024. If you haven't seen it yet, I strongly recommend you do so. Heartfelt thanks must go to those veterans who contributed their stories and memorabilia to make the exhibition such a compelling display.

Our cataloguing team continues to do great work in cataloguing all BDRSL Sub-Branch Memorabilia on the Victorian Collections Database. They have catalogued 7549 items as of 31st May 2024. The team has also catalogued the items inside the Havilah Road premises as well as the pieces in the Memorial Garden and grounds e.g. Spitfire, Bofors etc. These items are now discoverable on the Victorian Collections Database which will hopefully draw more visitors to the Sub-Branch.

We have hosted numerous visitor groups since the last newsletter; too many to mention in fact. Kym is doing a great job coordinating the various school and social groups which request visits and our ever-reliable tour guides are doing a fantastic job supporting him. For the first time we opened the Museum upon the completion of the ANZAC Day Dawn Service and saw 343 people file through the building. This was a record for us and followed on from the strong numbers over Easter.

We have successfully engaged academia and have had two (2) students (1 Deakin Univerity, 1 Melbourne University complete their placements where they spent 300 hours supporting BMM activities. We are looking to engage further university students once the new semester commences. We have also had three (3) work experience students within the BMM so far this year which has worked out well.

In closing, I'd like to acknowledge the tireless work of Lena (our Curator) and the support we receive from the office and maintenance staff. As stated previously, we can't do anything without our band of dedicated volunteers, and we truly appreciate their efforts and selflessness as well. 
