Welfare:

Our Welfare Team has been hard at work responding to numerous requests for support and proactively reaching out to our Service and Life Members. Regular phone calls and visits continue to ensure that Veterans and their families receive the resources and care they need. This year, we will again distribute Bendigo District RSL Vouchers,

providing Veterans and their partners the opportunity to enjoy the warm, welcoming atmosphere of our award-winning hospitality venue.



We remain committed to engaging with Veterans and their dependents through direct outreach and referrals. Behind the scenes, our Welfare Advocate and volunteers work tirelessly to ensure that those in need receive the vital support and referrals required.

Outreach and Engagement:

Our Sub-Branch remains highly active across the local community and beyond. The process of establishing the Central Victorian Veterans and Families Hub is progressing well, thanks to the collaboration between BDRSL, RSL Victoria, Bendigo Legacy Club, and the Vietnam Veterans Association Bendigo Branch. A special thanks to our working group and Sub-Branch Committee, who are nearing completion of the formal proposal.

Engagement with veterans continues through a variety of activities, including Veteran nights, Walk Talk Cuppa, golf, fitness sessions, morning teas, informal gatherings, and our Sheds programs. The "Faces of Peace" exhibition at the Bendigo Military Museum has been a resounding success, with many visitors gaining insight into our local Veterans' experiences.

We were also excited to host a Formal Mixed Military Dining Night, in collaboration with our Commemorative Committee, Central Victorian Veterans, and Bendigo Military Museum. This event aligned with the RSL Victoria theme of 'Peacekeepers, Peacemakers, and Peace Builders,' providing an opportunity for many to learn about the broader role of the ADF.

Collaboration:

We continue to strengthen our relationships with RSL State Executive, RSL Region 7, Legacy, the Vietnam Veterans Association Bendigo Branch, and other Ex-Service Organisations. Recent Region 7 meetings in Bendigo, Castlemaine, Koondrook, Swan Hill, and Woodend have been productive, fostering a united effort to support veterans.

LEST WE FORGET

The BDRSL Welfare Program, through the Welfare and Charitable Sub Committee delivers direct proactive support, connection and outreach to the Veteran community through face to face and telephone contact, and off-site visitation. Service personal identified through networking, word of mouth and direct referral are supported in-house and followed up directly by the Welfare Advocate. Other contacts are connected to appropriate adjunct agencies to facilitate both autonomous support and ease of access to those support interventions. The Welfare Program strongly networks with all local and statewide ESOs and support agencies to establish and cement sound relationships of support, trust, and integrity.

This quarterly report provides an overview of activities, initiatives, and developments pertaining to the W&CSC supported by the Bendigo District RSL during the reporting period of July - September 2024. The report highlights key achievements, challenges, and ongoing efforts to enhance the welfare and support of Veterans and their dependents in the region.

VETERANS ENGAGEMENT AND SUPPORT

Outreach:

In September 2023 the Welfare Program commenced an ambitious program to contact all Veterans and ex-service personnel on the RSLs database and within the District. Two primary volunteers have continued to deliver this initiative. At the time of writing close to 85% of service personnel, out of a total of close to 900, have been contacted and offered a welcome, connection, support, and assistance on their terms.

The consultative analysis undertaken post-contact identifies approximately 20% who are in need of or request support for common themes such as financial support, assistance with house/garden tasks, and opportunities for social inclusion. The majority of contacts require no further assistance and all express their gratitude for the initiative.



Follow Up:

If initial contact has not been successful – messages left, no voicemail, correct address but wrong phone. details etc. the Welfare Advocat will attempt to make contact again and will frequently make the decision to visit the last known address of the member. Consequently, contact details have been found to be outdated, members have moved to higher supported accommodation. Nursing homes, palliative care etc., or have deceased and that information has not passed on.


Ongoing Support:

Members are contacted regularly to provide and embed support frameworks and options until they are able to autonomously assume responsibility.

Financial Assistance:

Requests from Veterans for financial assistance cover a wide-ranging scope of needs. Financial assistance has been provided to address such issues as:

- Emergency motel accommodation
- Vehicle breakdown and repair
- Transport to attend medical interventions
- The completion of routine domestic tasks gardening/pruning/digging/tree removal etc. or Internal/external home maintenance replacing tiles/fixing fences/cleaning gutters.
- Purchase of split firewood for a TPI Vet
- Support for purchase of pharmaceutical products
- The provision of food/petrol vouchers, groceries purchase or the delivery of fresh take away or frozen meals to ensure adequate short-term sustainability.



At the time of writing the Welfare Program had financed Veteran's support of \$8900 for this financial year. There were also 30 take away and frozen meals distributed by the organisation in this timespan.

Requests for support are usually approved at the time. Prompt intervention enables Veterans to attain the support they need, when they need it, and without the need to experience further embarrassment or humiliation that might accompany cap-in-hand crisis Agency requests.

Additional support is quickly available for more urgent approval from both the Chair of Welfare & Charitable Sub-Committee and the BDRSL President.

External Support:

A strength-based networking and outreach strategy has been pursued by the incumbent Welfare Advocat. Local sister RSL agencies- Castlemaine/Heathcote/Shepparton have been contacted and key personnel communicated with. Organisations such as Lifeline Loddon Mallee, Veteran's Counselling Service, Uniting Agewell, Estia, Bupa, Anglicare for example have been networked within this report period.

- Total contacts include ad hoc walk ins, telephone contacts and call outs
- External referrals include DVA/white card issues, legal advice, Welfare support, financial support, Veteran's support services
- Financial assistance includes individual food / fuel vouchers, utilities support, home maintenance support:
- Meals distributed include individual fresh and frozen take away meals only
- Practical assistance includes assessment/authorising of home maintenance tasks, pickup from individual homes to appointments, liaising with 3rd parties etc.
- External representation includes: any initiated networking and collegial opportunities with sector colleagues and associated agencies.

Outreach and connection continue to identify issues such as:

- Many clients struggling with the impact of advancing age and the lessening of cognitive and physical capacity. This has an impact upon self-esteem and self-confidence.
- The difficulty involved in working through compensation issues with DVA. The Welfare Advocate has sourced other referral points for Military Compensation Advocacy and has safe, sensitive and competent agents acting on behalf of Veterans.
- The need for social connection which is absent from a lot of Veterans lives. A significant number speak of a sense of loneliness in their lives. Proactive inclusion is achieved through invitational outreach to the BDRSL Sheds program, Veteran's in-house social functions, and other affiliated community activities.
- Many Veterans need to seek support to complete routine domestic tasks such as gardening chores or internal / external home maintenance. Amongst other issues that this raises there are greater incurred financial expenses.

Upcoming Initiatives:

- The Welfare program continues to consider recruitment to bolster the endeavors of current members and sustain the committee.
- The Welfare & Charitable Sub-Committee continues to consider ways to resurrect the Hospital Visitation program that was in place before the impact of Covid closed contact and on-site visitation.
- More "welfare-specific" activities could be organised. The Welfare Advocat has commenced plans to aggressively drive this with the commencement of the new Veteran's Activities Coordinator.
- The up-coming Veteran's Health Week 13-20 Oct. provides the opportunity for new initiatives and contact possibilities.

The Welfare & Charitable Sub-Committee remains strongly committed to supporting the welfare of Veterans. We continue to foster a strong pro-active and supportive community for veterans in the region by supporting our veterans through effective welfare programs and initiatives to a place of wellbeing.

BENDIGO MILITARY MUSEUM

The Bendigo Military Museum continues its efforts to honour the service and sacrifice of local Veterans by preserving the rich military history of our region. We remain focused on working with the community to improve our collection and exhibits whilst planning for the future to provide a Museum the Sub-Branch can be proud of.

First and foremost, I must congratulate Peter Ball for winning the Volunteer of the Year Category of the Bendigo Business Excellence Awards. Peter has now followed that up by winning the Victorian Museums and Galleries "Volunteer of the Year Award". This is a significant acknowledgment of his tireless efforts over many years, and it is well deserved.

The "Faces of Peace" exhibition is in its last days, so if you haven't yet seen it, I strongly recommend you do so. Planning is well underway for our next exhibition 'Ink in the Lines'. This exhibition showcases Australia's modern veterans and their families, who through their tattoos commemorate the people, events and experiences which shaped their lives. This is due to open on the 7th Dec 2024.

Our cataloguing team continues to do great work in cataloguing all Bendigo District RSL Sub-Branch Memorabilia on the Victorian Collections Database. They have catalogued 7822 items as of 11th September 2024. The scanning and cataloguing of photo collections is going well and are being researched and sorted into categories. Examples are 70 x photos from RSM 57th Bn, Edgar Dawson DCM and 180 x photos of Arthur Holley RAN from his service on HMAS Hobart. We also received two suitcases of memorabilia from the family of Bill Theodore DSM. Bill served on HMAS Vendetta which did 39 runs into Tobruk so we now hold his photos taken in Tobruk, Derna and Syria.

We have had a busy few months with many groups visiting the Museum since the last report. We had a huge response to our call out to regional schools, with many taking advantage of the opportunity to visit the Museum e.g. Marong Primary School and Harcourt Valley PrimarySchool. We have five group bookings for September alone, so many thanks to Kym and his band of tour guides who make this work. Through their efforts they ensure the stories of local Veterans are passed on to future generations.

Plans to revamp the hallway space are being developed. We intend to move the Honour Boards and flags to make room for the Jack Grinton Photographs. This is a nationally significant collection which deserves to be showcased, and redeveloping the space is a cost-effective way to leave visitors with a positive first impression of the Museum.

It goes without saying, I'd like to acknowledge the tireless work of the Sub-Branch support staff and our band of dedicated volunteers. We truly appreciate their professionalism and dedication. 


