#### Welfare

Our Welfare Team continues to actively support our Service and Life Members, reaching out through countless phone calls and face-to-face interactions. Each veteran's situation is assessed carefully to provide the necessary resources and assistance.

Behind the scenes, considerable work is done to support vulnerable veterans and their dependents. Direct liaison, outreach, and referrals through VetCen ensure that those in need receive essential support and care.

#### **Outreach and Engagement**

Our Sub-Branch has remained highly engaged across the local community and broader region. We have formally initiated the establishment of a Central Victorian Veterans and Families Hub, collaborating with organisations such as RSL Victoria, Bendigo Legacy Club, and the Vietnam Veterans Association Bendigo Branch.

Our engagement efforts have extended through various events, including veteran nights, morning teas, informal gatherings, and the extensive Sheds Program. In addition, the Bendigo Military Museum's Ink in the Lines exhibition continues to highlight veterans' deeply personal service stories through the tattoos that commemorate their journeys.

#### Collaboration

We maintain strong connections with the RSL State Executive, RSL Region 7, and other Ex-Service Organisations to advance veteran support. The Region 7 circuit meetings throughout 2024, hosted in Bendigo, Castlemaine, Koondrook, Swan Hill, and Kangaroo Flat, have been productive in fostering collaboration and idea-sharing. We look forward to hosting the first Region 7 meeting of 2025 in Bendigo.



#### **Commemorative Activities**

Our Commemorative Sub-Committee has worked tirelessly to deliver recent commemorative events such as Beersheba Day and Remembrance Day. The Remembrance Day service was well-attended, with beautiful weather enhancing the solemn occasion.

The annual Poppy Appeal, a cornerstone of our fundraising efforts, has been highly successful thanks to our dedicated volunteers and supporting organisations.

### **VETERAN SUPPORT- HEALTH & WELLBEING**

This report provides an overview of activities, initiatives, and developments pertaining to the Health & Wellbeing Sub-Committee supported by the Bendigo District RSL during the reporting period of October – December 2024. The report highlights key achievements, challenges, and ongoing efforts to enhance the health and wellbeing of veterans in the region.

During this reporting period, the HWBSC continued its efforts to promote the physical, mental, and emotional wellbeing of our veterans and members. The BDRSL now has a Veterans Activities Officer; welcome Cassandra Liddy.

#### **Programs and Initiatives:**

During this period, the Health and Well Being Sub Committee facilitated the following regular activities for this reporting period:

- The Sheds programs offer Woodwork, Metalwork, Art, Gemstones, Leatherwork, Haircuts, Lead lighting and Computers.
- Group Cross-Fit.
- Yoga in conjunction with Kangaroo Flat RSL
- Veterans' Morning Tea.
- Veterans Golf.
- Walk, Talk & Cuppa in conjunction with Bendigo Veterans Exercise Program.
- An ongoing 3-month calendar of events for veterans' activities.
- An enhanced Veteran support brochure stand is displayed at the entry of the RSL providing support and activities offered.

#### Initiatives that have also occurred during this period are:

Sheds:

• OHS revamp in Sheds is continuing including Risk Assessments, Safe Work Procedures (SWP), Asset Inventory Management, Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) and remediation work. Templated SWP will be beside all machinery for compliance. Rectification of non-compliance prioritised and almost completed.



- Tag and Test all Electrical Items including 3 phase items completed. Non-RSL items removed / isolated / locked out.
- Clearing out of all disused and out of date items behind the sheds. Cleaning is ongoing.
- Marquee to be erected behind sheds during reduced tempo period after Christmas break.

These are located at the front entrance to the RSL, on the Bendigo District RSL Veteran Support and Central Victorian Veterans Facebook sites.



## **VETERAN SUPPORT- WELFARE & CHARITABLE**

The BDRSL Welfare Program, through the Welfare and Charitable Sub-Committee, delivers direct proactive support, connection and outreach to the Veteran community through face to face and telephone contact, and off-site visitation. Service personal identified through networking / word of mouth / direct referral are supported in-house and followed up directly by the Welfare Advocate. Other contacts are connected to appropriate adjunct agencies to facilitate both autonomous support and ease of access to those support interventions. The Welfare Program strongly networks with all local and State-wide ESOs and support agencies to establish and cement sound relationships of support, trust, and integrity.

This quarterly report provides an overview of activities, initiatives, and developments pertaining to the W&CSC supported by the Bendigo District RSL Sub-Branch during the reporting period of October - December 2024. The report highlights key achievements, challenges, and ongoing efforts to enhance the welfare and support of veterans and their dependents in the region.

#### Veterans Engagement and Support:

Outreach-

In September 2023 the Welfare Program commenced an ambitious program to contact all Veterans and ex-service personnel on the RSLs database and within the district. Two primary volunteers have continued to deliver this initiative. In 2024, close to 85% of service personnel– out of a total of close to 900 - have been contacted and offered welcome, connection, support, and assistance on their terms.

The consultative analysis undertaken post-contact identifies approximately 20% who are in need of or request support for common themes such as financial support, assistance with house/garden tasks, and opportunities for social inclusion. The majority of contacts require no further assistance and all express gratitude for the initiative.

#### Follow Up-

If initial contact has not been successful – messages left, no voicemail, address but wrong ph. details etc. - the Military Welfare Advocate will attempt to contact again and will frequently make the decision to visit the last known address of the member. Consequently, contact details have been found to be outdated, members have moved to higher supported accommodation - nursing homes, palliative care etc. – or have since deceased and that information had not been passed on.

#### **Ongoing Support-**

Members are contacted regularly to provide and embed support frameworks and options until they are able to autonomously assume responsibility.

Several members are contacted / visited monthly to follow up initial points of interest, and also to keep social connection and contact.



### **VETERAN SUPPORT- WELFARE & CHARITABLE**

At the time of writing Welfare had received 140 first off client-initiated contacts, outreached to 138 home/residential care/nursing home addresses, and sent 47 follow up letters of introduction and offers of support.

#### Financial Assistance:

Requests from Veterans for financial assistance cover a wide-ranging scope of needs. Financial assistance has been provided to address such issues as:

- Vehicle breakdown and repair.
- Support for rental issues or paying of security bond.
- The completion of routine domestic tasks gardening/pruning/digging/tree removal etc or -Internal/external home maintenance - replacing tiles/fixing fences/cleaning gutters.
- Support for purchase of pharmaceutical products.
- The provision of food/petrol vouchers, groceries purchase or the delivery of fresh T/A or frozen meals to ensure adequate short-term sustainability.

At the time of writing Welfare had financ<mark>ed various forms of veterans sup</mark>port this financial year. There were also many takeaway and f<mark>rozen Bistro meals distributed in</mark> this timespan.

Through the Welfare and Charitable committee, requests for support are usually approved quickly. Prompt intervention enables Veterans to attain the support they need, when they need it, and without the need to experience further embarrassment or humiliation that might accompany cap-inhand crisis Agency requests.

Additional support is quickly available for more urgent approval from both the Chair of W&CSC and the BDRSL President.

#### **External Support:**

A strength-based networking and outreach strategy has been pursued by the incumbent Military Welfare Advocate. Local sister RSL agencies- Castlemaine/Heathcote/Shepparton have been contacted and key personnel communicated with. Organisations such as Lifeline Loddon Mallee, Veteran's Counselling Service, Uniting Agewell, Estia, Bupa, Anglicare for example have been networked within this report period.

#### Outreach and connection continue to identify issues such as:

- Many clients struggling with the impact of advancing age and the lessening of cognitive and physical capacity. This has an impact upon self-esteem and self-confidence.
- The difficulty involved in working through Compensation issues with DVA. The Military Welfare Advocate has sourced other referral points for Military Compensation Advocacy and has safe, sensitive and competent agents acting on behalf of Veterans.
- The need for social connection which is absent from a lot of Veterans lives. A significant number speak of a sense of loneliness in their lives. Proactive inclusion is achieved through invitational outreach to the BDRSL Sheds program, Veteran's in-house social functions, and other affiliated community activities.
- Many Veterans need to seek support to complete routine domestic tasks such as gardening chores or internal / external home maintenance. Among other issues that this raises, there are greater incurred financial expenses.

### **VETERAN SUPPORT- HEALTH AND WELLBEING**

#### Upcoming Initiatives:

- The Welfare program continues to consider recruitment to bolster the endeavours of current members and sustain the committee.
- The Welfare Hub utilised by veterans.
- The Welfare & Charitable Sub-Committee continues to consider ways to resurrect the Hospital Visitation program that was in place before the impact of Covid closed contact and on-site visitation. At present, one experienced former 'visitor' has expressed interest in the role.



Initial contacts include: any 1st ad hoc walk ins, telephone contacts, offsite visits and calls out.

- Financial assistance includes individual food / fuel vouchers, utilities support, home maintenance support.
- Meals distributed includes individual fresh & frozen take away meals only.
- External referrals include DVA/white card issues, legal advice, Welfare support, financial support, Veteran's support services.
- External representation includes: any initiated networking and collegial opportunities with sector colleagues and associated agencies.
- Outreach covers onsite F2F home/hospital/supportive care visitation.
- Follow up written correspondence if no response from visit.

The Welfare & Charitable Sub-Committee remains strongly committed to supporting the welfare of Veterans. We continue to foster a strong pro-active and supportive community for veterans in the region by supporting our veterans through effective welfare programs and initiatives to a place of wellbeing.

## **BENDIGO MILITARY MUSEUM**


The Bendigo Military Museum (BMM) continues its efforts to honour the service and sacrifice of local veterans by preserving the rich military history of our region. We remain focused on working with the community to improve our collection and exhibits whilst planning for the future to provide a Museum the Sub-Branch can be proud of.

Again, I must congratulate Peter Ball for receiving the RSL Meritorious Service Award for his many years of dedication and selflessness within the Sub-Branch. The BMM would be lost if not for Peter's knowledge and organisational skills. Well done, Peter.

The "Faces of Peace" exhibition is in has now concluded and the launch for the new exhibition "Ink in the Lines" took place on Friday 6th December 2024. The opening was well attended and is certainly worth a look. The exhibition showcases Australia's modern veterans and their families who, through their tattoos, commemorate the people, events and experiences which shaped their lives. Looking forward, our exhibition schedule is as follows:

- Ink in the Lines: 7th December 2024 27th April 2025.
- Royal Australian Survey Corps 110th Anniversary: 10th May 10th August 2025.
- George Petrou The Art of Sacrifice: 23rd August 2025 18th January 2026.
- Nasho '57: 98 Days at Pucka: 31st January 2026 21st June 2026.
- First Nations Stories of Service: 4th July 2026 28th February 2027.
- Persona: A contemporary Veterans artist tour 20th March 19th September 2027.

Donations of memorabilia from familie who want to find a permanent home for the items continue to be received. The cataloguing team continues to do great work ensuring it is all recorded in the Victorian Collections Database. They have catalogued 7902 items as of 30th November 2024. The Ex-Fortuna crew and Passchendaele Barracks Trust, are also working away and adding to the catalogued collection. We are looking to acquire a scanner that will scan 35mm negatives which is another trove of history needing to be catalogued.



We continue to apply for grants to assist with the operational costs of running the exhibitions and have had better than moderate success in 2024. This is in no small part to the BMM Curator's ability to submit compelling business cases, so I thank her for her efforts.

2024 has been a very busy year for visitors with many school groups and tour groups being hosted. Just on 600 local students have visited the museum this year, which is a fantastic statistic and ensures the stories of local veterans is passed on. In November alone, we had 11 groups come through the museum, so I'd like to sincerely thank Kym and everyone else who helped. Without their support the museum's outreach program would be very limited.

## **BENDIGO MILITARY MUSEUM**

Since the last members' meeting, the vandalism that occurred at the Museum where oil had been sprayed on the building has been repaired. The Bendigo Council engaged the Grimwade Centre from the University of Melbourne for this repair/restoration work, and they have done an amazing job. Aside from the SMI, they've also cleaned the Boer War statue and Eaglehawk Cenotaph.




