PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Dear Bendigo District RSL Sub-Branch Inc. Members and Families,

I trust this report finds you well as we move into the colder months, following our AGM and Anzac Day commemorations. The post-Christmas period has been notably busy, with our focus directed towards many significant events.

Welfare:

Our Welfare Team continues its vital work, reaching out to all Life and Service Members. This is a substantial undertaking, and the subsequent referrals and advocacy efforts represent another layer of essential support. These personalised communications help us assess each Veteran's situation and ensure they are connected to the necessary resources.

Outreach and Engagement:

Our Sub-Branch remains active across our facilities, in the local community, and throughout the broader region. A major highlight was the announcement, just prior to Anzac Day, that the Central Victorian Veterans and Families Hub will receive the full \$5 million in funding we had been seeking—an achievement supported by both major political parties.

This outcome spares us significant time and resources in the application process and will deliver enormous benefit to Veterans and families across the region. The Hub will consult and collaborate with the Bendigo District RSL, RSL Victoria, Bendigo Legacy Club, and the Vietnam Veterans Association Bendigo Branch to support our Veterans and their Families.

Engagement with Veterans remains strong through our Veteran Nights, morning teas, informal gatherings, and the Sheds Program.

The Bendigo Military Museum's 'Ink in the Lines' exhibition concluded its successful run from 7 December 2024 to 27 April 2025. Replacing it is 'Map Makers'.

This is a special exhibition marking the 110th Anniversary of the Royal Australian Survey Corps. Curated by the Ex-Fortuna Survey Association and presented by the Bendigo Military Museum, this exhibition honours the legacy of military surveyors from World War 1 through to 1996 and highlights Bendigo's own Fortuna Villa as a vital centre of operations.

Collaboration:

We continue to maintain strong partnerships with the RSL State Executive, Region 7, and other Ex-Service Organisations. At the recent Region 7 AGM, I was honoured to be nominated and elected as Chair of this Region of Sub-Branches. I pledge my continued dedication to serving Sub-Branches across our area—from Koondrook to Wedderburn, Heathcote to Sunbury, and all in around and between.

In a step forward for efficiency and accessibility, the upcoming State Conference on 12 July 2025 will be relayed via ICT to Bendigo, saving time and resources for many Sub-Branches. Further details have been provided at the June General Members Meeting.

VETERAN SUPPORT- WELFARE

Bendigo District RSL Welfare and Charitable Sub-committee (WCSC) continues to deliver direct proactive intervention, connection and support to the Bendigo District Veteran and Ex Service Personnel community.

Through face to face and telephone contact, and off-site outreach, service personnel are supported inhouse and followed up directly by the Welfare Advocate. Other personnel as required are connected to appropriate adjunct agencies to facilitate both autonomous support and ease of access to those support interventions.

To this aim the Welfare Program continues to instigate strong networks with all local and Statewide ESOs to establish and cement sound relationships of support, trust, and integrity.

In August 2023 WCSC volunteers commenced contacting all identified Veterans within the district. At the recent completion of this commitment more than 900 individual service personnel have been contacted and offered welcome, connection, support, and assistance (if required) on their terms. With the support of the Subcommittee the Welfare Advocate has followed up every service personnel contacted. It cannot be overstated how important and beneficial this direct contact is.

WCSC receives requests for financial assistance from Veterans across a range of needs. Financial support has been provided to address such issues as.

- The completion of routine domestic tasks.
- Relocation expenses.
- Short term emergency accommodation.
- The hardship brought on Veterans who live with minimal fixed income.
- The provision of food/petrol vouchers or the delivery of bistro meals.
- Garden and yard maintenance that is now beyond the capacity of the residents.


Prompt discrete intervention enables Veterans to attain the support they need when they need it.

Pro-active outreach to local aged care, supportive accommodation residences, Lifestyle Communities, and nursing homes continues in an endeavour to seek, contact and support our service population.

The WCSC offers sensitive, timely and accountable commitment to supporting the welfare of all returned and current service personnel and their families. The program continues to foster a strong and supportive community for Veterans in the region by supporting a dignified pathway from "welfare to wellbeing".

- Hours external provider engaged.
- Hours internal home support cleaning etc. engaged.
- Accommodation
- Total outlaid to date.
- Outreach covers onsite Face to Face home/hospital/supportive care visitation.
- External referrals include: DVA white/gold card issues, legal advice, Mental Health and Welfare support, financial support, Veteran's support services.
- External representation includes: any initiated networking and collegial opportunities with sector colleagues and associated agencies.

During this reporting period, the Health and Wellbeing Sub-Committee (HWPSC) continued its efforts to promote the physical, mental, and emotional wellbeing of our Veterans and members.

Programs and Initiatives:

During this period, HWPSC facilitated the following regular activities for this reporting period:

- The Sheds programs offer Woodwork, Metalwork, Art, Gemstones, Leatherwork, Haircuts, Lead lighting and Computers.
- Group Cross-Fit.
- Yoga in conjunction with Kangaroo Flat RSL.
- Veterans' Morning Tea.
- Veterans Golf followed by lunch at the BDRSL.
- Fortnightly Walk, Talk & Cuppa in conjunction with Bendigo Veterans Exercise Program.
- An ongoing 3-month calendar of events for veterans' activities.



Initiatives that have also occurred during this period are:

Sheds:

- Clearing out of all disused and out of date items. Housekeeping continues.
- A marquee has been erected behind the sheds during the period after Christmas break. This has helped to combat the heat and provide much needed shade in our metalworks area.
- The Gem Club has taken a hiatus as we look into other areas of special interest.
- Veterans Christmas Lunch during mid-December, for our Veterans and their dependent, Hit FM were in attendance handing out Christmas vouchers to random Veteran participants.
- Barefoot Bowls held in February. This was A fun filled afternoon in the sun followed by a BBQ with the
 assistance of the North Bendigo Bowling Club, with our best turnout of 40 Veterans and their dependents in
 attendance.
- Fosterville Gold Mine Open Day, Veterans and their families were invited out to the Fosterville Goldmine to tour the facilities, have a turn at panning for gold and hold a giant Gold Nugget.
- Ten pin bowling, during March our Veterans and their families got together and put on a show of competition trying to outdo each other.








VETERAN SUPPORT- HEALTH AND WELLBEING



















BENDIGO MILITARY MUSEUM

January - June 2025:

The first half of 2025 has been a dynamic and rewarding period for the Bendigo Military Museum, marked by strong visitor engagement, landmark projects, and national recognition.

Exhibitions:

- Ink in the Lines (Dec 2024 Apr 2025) from the Australian War Memorial drew 1,815 visitors, exploring how Veterans use tattoos to process their service.
- The Mapmakers (May Aug 2025), developed with Royal Australian Survey Veterans for their 110th anniversary, features 2 new videos created through a 2024 COGB Grant.
- Coming soon: The Art of Sacrifice (Aug 2025 Jan 2026).



The Museum's Significance Assessment was completed in early 2025 with the help of Dr Megan Cardamone. The ninety seven-page report confirms that the BMM holds 'one of the largest and most significant military collections in Australia' — a major achievement for our community of volunteers. We've now applied for funding to begin a Preservation Needs Assessment.

Facility improvements include:

- Newly purchased 3D scanner for fragile and/or large collection items
- Newly procured device capable of monitoring light and LUX levels in the exhibition spaces
- · Fresh repainting of gallery space
- HVAC and lift repairs
- Ongoing work with COGB on security, exits, and maintenance

Grants & Projects:

- Our Saluting Their Service Grant is supporting development of a state-of-the-art soundscape, which will be
 accessible via a free app. It will blend veteran voices, ceremonial sounds, and ambient audio across the
 Museum and Pall Mall precinct.
- Through a Victoria Remembers Grant (in partnership with VVAB), we're producing 10 short films capturing the
 personal reflections of 10 local Vietnam Veterans.
- In March we were honoured to win the Digital Storytelling Award at the '2024 Victorian Community History Awards' for our Faces of Peace series.
- A new COGB Community Grant will fund a new negatives and slide scanner capable of preserving the Royal Australian Survey Corps important photographic collection.



Community Engagement

- 20+ school and community groups have visited the Museum so far this year.
- Hundreds visited the BMM after the ANZAC Dawn Service for reflection and remembrance.
- 3 successful events delivered as part of the Australian Heritage Festival, including an 'Antiques Roadshow-style' event and 2 behind-the-scenes building tours.
- Please help us reach the Top 5 Bendigo Attractions on Tripadvisor leave a review if you've visited in the past year!

OH&S and Security

- Progress made on staff safety training and site security.
- Investigations underway for improved security, back gate security, and duress alarms in the collections area.


Our courtesy bus is supplied for the use of all members and guests. The bus is available Thursday through to Saturday each week from 4.30pm until 9.00pm.
