PRESIDENT'S REPORT



As we say goodbye to 2025 and have enjoyed the Christmas and New Year period, I hope this report finds you well, safe, and able to reflect proudly on the collective achievements of our Sub-Branch throughout the year.

The past quarter has been marked by significant growth, meaningful commemorative activities, strengthened partnerships, and a sustained focus on the wellbeing of our veteran community. I am pleased to present this report outlining our progress, challenges, and successes across all areas of our operations.

Membership:

Our membership continues to grow strongly across all categories, reflecting the strength, relevance, and community trust in our Sub-Branch:

- Service Members: 923 (including 11 Life Members (N/C)) – up by 3
- Affiliate Members: 958 – up by 57
- Community Members: 5,974 – up by 595
- Total Membership: 7,855 – an overall increase of 655

Veteran Support:

Veteran Support remains the cornerstone of our mission and the most important area of Sub-Branch responsibility. Over the past quarter, our Veteran Support Team has shown exceptional dedication through:

- Veterans' Morning Teas providing social connection and peer support
- Supportive referrals to specialist services
- Multiple home visits, wellbeing checks, and financial assistance matters
- Ongoing engagement with veterans in aged care and nursing homes
- Regular participation in meetings and case coordination activities

Our fundraising initiatives continue to support vital welfare, wellbeing, and commemorative services:

- Veterans Night (1st Friday monthly): averaging approx. \$600 raised
- CVV Night (2nd Friday monthly)
- Poppy Appeal 2025: \$71,057 raised

This is a significant achievement and a testament to the hard work of our Appeals volunteers, community partners, schools, and supporters across Greater Bendigo.

Outreach & Engagement:

Our ongoing commitment to strengthening community connections included:

- Regular Veterans Nights, Morning Teas, and informal gatherings.
- Continued engagement through the Sheds Program, supporting camaraderie, skills development, and wellbeing.

Collaboration:

We met with the Bendigo Regional ADF Senior Leadership Team and hosted a forum involving RSL Victoria, BDRSL, and Legacy representatives. This session strengthens collaboration with serving members and transitioning veterans and will continue to grow in importance as the Central Victoria Veterans and Families Hub gains momentum.

VETERAN SUPPORT - WELFARE

The Bendigo District RSL Welfare and Charitable Sub-Committee (WCSC) commits to proactive intervention, connection and support to the Bendigo and district Veteran and ex-service personnel (ESP) community.

This quarterly report provides a summary of activities, initiatives, and developments pertaining to the Welfare Sub Committee supported by the Bendigo District RSL during the reporting period of 1st September to 30th November 2025.

VETERANS ENGAGEMENT AND SUPPORT:

The Welfare Program continues to proactively engage with the 900+ service members across the region and offer welcome, connection, support, and assistance on their terms.

For this quarter 22 new contacts for support were registered. Onsite welfare visitations to members homes or other supported accommodation locations numbered 51 attendances. Over the last two years in particular outreach has identified “hidden Veterans” who have slipped through the cracks – not being on the data base for various reasons, or being secreted in aged/infirmied/supportive care. These members are followed up as a matter of priority.

Financial Assistance:

BDRSL Welfare supports Veterans and ESP with financial assistance across a range of needs. This can include needs such as:

- The hardship brought on Veterans who live with minimal fixed income to be meet the impact of unforeseen bills and additional expenses.
- The completion of routine domestic tasks - gardening/pruning/digging or internal/external home maintenance – replacing tiles/fixing fences/cleaning gutters that can no longer be attempted as a matter of safety.
- The provision of food/petrol vouchers or the delivery of take away meals to ensure adequate short-term sustainability:
- Short term emergency accommodation.
- Relocation expenses.
- The purchase of basic furniture and home items.

RSLVIC requires a discrete benevolence assessment to ensure that Veterans' needs are fully comprehended and that there is transparency in usage and spending of funds. The WCSC approved 24 requests for financial assistance within the reporting quarter, most of which were approved at the time of request. Additional direction and counsel if/when required are provided through the WCSC Chair and the BDRSL President. This prompt assessment and intervention enables Veterans to attain the support they need, when they need it, and without the need to experience discomfort or embarrassment that might accompany cap-in-hand external crisis Agency requests.

Recent examples of this assistance have included:

- Emergency motel accommodation for a Veteran who is impacted by homelessness, financial and mental health issues;
- Purchase of 3mtrs of firewood for a Veteran who is no longer physically able to cut and split his own;
- Automotive support for a Veteran on a fixed income;
- Hire of an orthopaedic wheelchair to enable a Veteran to leave their supported accommodation with safety and comfort;
- 17 hrs of garden support across 4 Veterans who are now no longer able to care for their properties as they used to do or maintain their residences safely to an appropriate standard.
- 10 take away meals provided by BDRSL to support 4 Veterans until other options could be arranged.



VETERAN SUPPORT - WELFARE

Welfare Funeral Support:

BDRSL provides both presence and the delivery of the RSL Funeral Ritual at Veteran's funeral services. This is delivered by suitably qualified ex-service personnel to ensure that Veterans are accorded appropriate recognition of their military commitment at their last parade. Additional personnel have recently been recruited to this volunteer role.



- Initial contacts include: any 1st up telephone contacts, offsite visits, ad hoc walk ins, and calls out.
- Subsequent contact includes all post-initial contact – F2F, ph., email/text.
- Meals distributed: individual fresh & frozen take away bistro meals.
- Financial support food/fuel.
- Hours external provider engaged.
- Hours internal home support – cleaning etc. engaged.
- Accommodation x Nights.
- Benevolent Assessment completed.
- Total outlaid to date.
- Outreach covers onsite F2F home/hospital/supportive care visitation.
- Follow up written correspondence if no response.
- External referrals include: DVA/white card issues, legal advice, Mental Health and Welfare support, financial support, Veteran's support services.
- External representation includes: any initiated networking opportunities with colleagues and associated agencies.

Pertinent Factors Raised:

Welfare outreach with Veterans and ESP has identified key intervention segues such as:

- The need for social connection which is absent from a lot of Veterans lives. A significant number speak of a sense of loneliness in their lives.
- Support to engage with statutory bodies regarding military compensation and medical support entitlements. The access to vigorous compensation advocacy cannot be overstated.
- The loss of personal autonomy in needing to reach out for external support.
- The need for many Veterans to seek support to complete routine domestic tasks such as gardening chores or internal / external home maintenance. Amongst other issues that this raises are the greater incurred financial expenses.
- The struggle with the impact of advancing age and the lessening of cognitive and physical capacity. Many speak of the impact that this has upon self-esteem and self-confidence.

VETERAN SUPPORT - WELFARE

Networking and Collaboration:

The WCSC continues to build upon the already established networks and relationships that have been developed over time with local ESOs and key personnel. Key support agencies – Legacy, CVVSC, VVA, Open Arms, Carry On for example - are committed allies with BDRSL in the support of local Veterans.

Currently there is pre-planning in place to progress opportunities with lead ESOs to share resources and measures to enable referring between other agencies to occur in a sensitive, respectful, and timely manner.

Ongoing Initiatives:

The WCSC continues to consider ways to resurrect the Hospital and Home Visitation program that was in place before the impact of Covid closed down contact and on-site visitation. Recent recruitment into this role has been valuable.

The Welfare program of the WCSC offers sensitive, timely and accountable commitment to supporting the welfare of all returned and current service personnel and their families. The program continues to foster a strong and supportive community for veterans in the region by supporting their pathway from “welfare to wellbeing” and providing a dignified pathway for ease of access to support that transition.

VETERAN SUPPORT - HEALTH & WELLBEING

This report provides an overview of activities, initiatives, and developments pertaining to the Health & Wellbeing Sub-Committee supported by the Bendigo District RSL during the reporting period of 1st September – 30 November 2025. The report highlights key achievements, challenges, and ongoing efforts to enhance the health and wellbeing of veterans in the region.

- During this reporting period, the Health and Wellbeing Sub-Committee continued its commitment to promoting wellness among our veterans and members during the year.

Programs and Initiatives:

- The following activities were facilitated during the reporting period:
 - Sheds Program
 - Activities include woodwork, metalwork, art, leatherwork, haircuts, lead lighting, and computer skills.
 - The Sheds Program underwent significant improvements to ensure safety and efficiency including:
 1. Ongoing OHS revamp, including risk assessments, Safe Work Procedures (SWP), and updates to asset inventory and Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS).
 2. SWP templates installed beside all machinery for compliance.
 3. Electrical items, including three-phase equipment, tagged and tested; non-compliant items removed or isolated.
 4. Housekeeping initiatives included clearing disused items and prioritizing rectification of non-compliance.


- Vietnam Veterans of Australia (FSB Bendigo) for the use of their facilities throughout the Appeal.

BENDIGO MILITARY MUSEUM

The Bendigo Military Museum continues its efforts to honour the service and sacrifice of local veterans by preserving the rich military history of our region. The Museum received another accolade for its efforts so I must congratulate our volunteers for being awarded the Victorian Collections 2023-25 Cataloguing "Best in Show" Honouree. Well done!

Strategic Planning:

Bendigo Heritage Partnership - As reported at the last Members Meeting, discussions are on-going with the Bendigo Heritage Association regarding a partnership focussing on the following:

- Joint marketing management, planning and coordination.
- Shared resources to allow the BMM to open in alignment with BHA opening hours
- Access to BHA's schools and visitor program

A number of meetings have now occurred between Sub-Branch and BHA representatives, and we continue to work towards an amicable agreement that is a win-win for both parties.

Storyscape Project- The audiovisual Storyscape project is on track with the successful site testing conducted in early December involving a number of volunteers. This will provide the museum with an enviable audio system for visitors to access through their phones or museum provided headsets. This system is funded through the Saluting their Service grant and Museum donations and will become fully operational in May 2026.

BENDIGO MILITARY MUSEUM

Billiard Room: The redevelopment of the Billiard Room has progressed to a point where we have an agreed design for the room which will cover the various operations and theatres from Korea to Afghanistan. This will be a state-of-the-art immersive experience and Challis Designs have estimated the cost of the redevelopment to be approximately \$400k which will have to be met via grants and donations. Sadly, our contracted project manager Mr. Ian Ross has stood down, and the project has stalled, so a new strategy will be required to ensure this important component of our Military history is completed.

Exhibitions:

George Petrou – The Art of the Sacrifice is on display until the end of January 2026. The exhibition showcases George Petrou's deeply personal journey - an artist's tribute to Australia's service personnel, born from his own battle with cancer. Please make the time to view this impressive exhibition.

Looking forward, our exhibition schedule is as follows:

- Nasho '57: 98 Days at Pucka: 31st January 2026 – 26th July 2026.
- Persona: A contemporary Veterans artist tour 8th August – 31st January 2027.

Coordination:

Our Cataloguing team continues to do great work, and they have catalogued 9667 items as of 7th Dec 2025; this is an increase of 500 items since the last report. The Ex-Fortuna crew and Passchendaele Barracks also continue to work away and add to the catalogued collection.

Group Bookings- There has been a steady flow of visitors through the Museum and we have hosted 8 groups since the last report. Some of these groups included the Mad Hatters Ladies Group, Catherine Macauley College, the Indie School and the SA Army History Group who were most impressed with our collection. Many thanks to Kym and his team once again for pulling these together.
